

Town of Woodboro Board of Supervisors  
Monthly meeting minutes  
March 11, 2014

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Meeting was called to order at 6:02 p.m. by Chairperson Sherry Tischendorf.

Meeting was posted in 3 of the 4 normal posting places within the township.

Board members present were Chairperson Sherry Tischendorf, Supervisor Phil Kriesel, Treasurer Tina Schmidt and Clerk Sue Ann Johnson. Absent was Supervisor Lois Haese.

The treasurer gave a report of an adjusted balance of \$510,987.27.

First agenda item was the Squash Lake Association request for a letter of support from the town in regards to a possible AIS grant. Supervisor Kriesel made a motion and seconded by Chairperson Tischendorf for Chairperson Tischendorf to write this letter.

Next agenda item was the per diem resolution-this item was tabled until next month.

Next agenda item was the Woodboro Lakes wildlife area proposed ATV trail. Chairperson Tischendorf made a motion seconded by Supervisor Kriesel, that the town of Woodboro would like to go on record that they would support the request for the Nokomis ATV trail route using either access but would prefer they use the route that goes out to Oneida Lake Rd rather than using Oscar Jenne Lake Rd or what is referred to as option B instead of option A on the map. Motion passed all ayes.

Next agenda item was the spring election. The clerk showed and read the audience a sample ballot from the election that will be held April 1<sup>st</sup>.

Next agenda item was Hancock Lake rezoning some parcels. Chairperson Tischendorf stated that the town would like to rezone

the parcels on the end of Dombrowski Rd currently zoned business. Chairperson Tischendorf made a motion and seconded by Supervisor Kriesel to start the petition to have the section of Hancock Lake that is now zoned business, rezoned to single family. Once the county receives this petition the county will take on the responsibility of notifying the affected landowners. There is no cost to the town. Motion passed all ayes.

Next agenda item 9.78 sign regulations-request from Oneida county for input from the town. Supervisor Kriesel talked with Karl Jennrich and found out lots of towns are opposed to these signs. Supervisor Kriesel is also opposed. Supervisor Kriesel made a motion seconded by Chairperson Tischendorf to let Karl Jennrich know that the Town of Woodboro is not in favor of the proliferation of the signs allowed in 9.78 sign regulations.

Next agenda item was Denny Thompson, Oneida County board supervisor, Denny was not present but the board had lots of good things to say about him. Denny did a lot of good things while on the county board, he will be missed.

Next agenda item Town Roads;

Some complaints received were discussed. The snowplows have been out removing the slush from the roads. It is unsure when the road limit signs will go up. The town will put them up when Oneida County does theirs. The TRIP can be filled out but cannot be submitted yet.

Chairperson Tischendorf made a motion and seconded by Supervisor Kriesel to sign the special assessment agreement with the county and return it to the county treasurer. Motion passed all ayes.

Chairperson Tischendorf made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:01 p.m. seconded by Supervisor Kriesel.
